## 2022 Joint Road Rehabilitation Program

*The Village will again be participating in a Joint Bid Road program with Mundelein, Vernon Hills, and the Libertyville Township Road District to continue to receive advantageous pricing by achieving "economics of scale" from larger contract quantities. This is the fourth year the Village will be participating in the Joint Road Program with its neighbors.*

The program involves removal of curbs and gutters (extent varies depending upon the street), as well as pavement patching, removal (grinding) of the pavement surface, and placement of new binder and surface ("shave and pave"). Residents will be notified when work begins on their street and if work will impede access to their driveways. The following roadways are scheduled for this season:

- Briarwood Lane from Greentree Parkway to Greentree Parkway
- Spruce Court from Greentree Parkway to Dead End
- Oak Street from W. Austin Avenue to Rockland Road
- Circle Drive from W. Rockland Road to Dead End
- Sunnyside Place from S. Stewart Avenue to Milwaukee Avenue
- Havenwood from Drive Harms Avenue to Dymond Road
- Havenwood Court from Havenwood Drive to Dead End
- American Way from US RT. 45. to Winchester Road
- Old Peterson Road from 400' W. of Butterfield Road to Dead End 1,950 FT (0.37 Miles) 5,200 SY
- Commerce Drive from Franklin Blvd. to Harris Road
- Florence Court from S. Stewart Avenue to West End
- West Ellis Avenue from W. Winchester Road to 500 FT South of the Winchester Road Intersection **(limited patching work only)**
- Fifth Avenue from Park Avenue to Church Street (limited patching work only).
- School Street from Milwaukee Avenue to School Street Park Lot Entrance **(curb removal/replacement work only)**
