



Cul-De-Sac Native Planting Program Guidelines/Instructions

The native planting cul-de-sac program is an opportunity for residents on a cul-de-sac to plant native species in the circular unpaved section in the middle of the cul-de-sac with financial assistance from the Village of Libertyville.

General Overview:

- Reimbursement program for up to 75% of the cost of **native plant material**, not to exceed \$750 (cost for installation, equipment, etc. is **not** applicable)
- Property owners are responsible for installation and maintenance, to include watering, weeding, pruning and general upkeep of the appearance
- Submitted proposals will be reviewed, to include ensuring the plant species are native to the region and suited for the site
- Failure to maintain the installed plant material may result in removal by the Village of Libertyville
- Libertyville High School's sustainability club, ECOS, is happy to assist with your project. They can propose a design template tailored to your cul-du-sac and offer competitive pricing for commercially grown native plant species that are approved for use by the Village. Application Process:

- Provide a completed application with the following:
 - Existing conditions photograph
 - Proposed layout/design diagram
 - Executed maintenance agreement
 - Neighbor consent form
 - Return items to aengelmann@libertyville.com

Post Application:

- Complete installation within 60 days of approval (or otherwise agreed upon date)
- Submit a post- planting photograph
- Schedule an inspection of the completed project within 30 days
- Submit copies of all receipts for reimbursement to aengelmann@libertyville.com within 60 days of project completion
